Speaker Dr. Leonard, CEO of Carle Foundation, talked about COVID and the impact it has had on Carle:

Dr. Leonard spoke about making their facilities and the community safe from the spread of COVID by placing safety measures in place and implementing protective equipment. The lockdown of elective surgeries in the beginning parts of COVID has flatten the curve of the spread of COVID. By doing so, this has spread the treatment of COVID over a period of time to make it manageable for the hospital to treat it. Outpatient facilities were significantly impacted by COVID with no one coming in for elective surgeries. In April Carle had 8000 employees working and half of them started working from home. The ER and convenient care facilities are getting increased visits. The week before the shutdown Carle saw 47 patients on E-visits and a few weeks after Carle had 6000 visits on E-visits. Going forward Dr. Leonard thinks COVID will be around for another 12 months and a vaccine might be in place within the next few months.

Speaker Dennis Hesch, CEO of Health Alliance, talked about the relationship between Health Alliance and IERMP:

Dennis Hesch announced that Health Alliance is going to present a check to the IERMP for a \$300,000 wellness credit to use as the IERMP sees fit. Membership needs to be kept around 3,000 or at least 23 school districts must remain in the IERMP for a 2 year period.

Financials

Bismark-Henning CUSD #1 moved and GCMS Community Unit School District #5 seconded the motion to approve financials through August 27, 2020. The financials show income as \$1,671,870.56 and total expenses totaling \$1,492,154.66 for an actual net monthly income of \$179,715.90. Balance in the trust account is \$805,468.72. Unpaid claims total \$0, total claims for the month total \$1,327,478.90.

Discussion of the actuary's, Kelly Grebinsky, projections for the 2021 renewal:

Kelly Grebinsky announced that the trust is running better than originally projected, so for 2021 he is projecting the renewal to come in under 10% - better than projected from last year. A few things he is looking at to finalize numbers is the stay-at-home impact the future cost of COVID vaccinations for 2021. Final renewal increase will be determined at September's Executive Board meeting.

Discussion on the IBNR termination:

Several schools have been asking how the IBNR termination language reads in case a district decides to leave the trust, so Kelly Grebinsky typed up a one page explanation. This is also outlined in the Intergovernmental Agreement. The district is responsible for claims that are paid just for that district after the district leaves the trust. The terminating school's IBNR will be calculated per member based on total Trust membership by dividing the total IBNR by the average membership over the last three months. This number is then multiplied with the terminating school district's three-month average membership. This final number is divided by 12 months and

the district will make monthly payments to the trust and there will be true-up at the end of year. At the end of the year a reconciliation will take place and if the district paid too much - they will get reimbursed and if the district didn't pay exough - then the district owes the trust the difference. The Executive Board has the sole discretion to implement a Special Assessment to all districts currently in the trust and districts who have left the trust within the past 3 years

Discussion and approved D & O insurance:

Fisher CUSD 1 moved and St. Joseph-Ogden CHSD #305 seconded to go with Professional Solutions Insurance Company with the D&O insurance. This policy has the same coverage as the current policy with a lower premium.

Discussion of schools who have submitted their letter of intent to withdrawal for 1/2021:

To date these are the schools who have submitted their letter of intent to withdrawal for 2021: Bismark-Henning CUSD #1, Blue Ridge Community Unit School District #18, Community Unit School District #7, Edgar County CUSD #6, Georgetown-Ridge Farm Community Unit School District #4, Gifford Community School District #188, Hoopeston Area CUSD #11, Prairieview Ogden CUSD #197, Rural Champaign County Special Education Cooperative, Salt Fork CUSD #512 and St. Joseph CCSD 169. Letters need to be submitted by midnight on August 31s and can be rescinded by November 1s.

Discussion on the 2021 ancillary renewal:

Ancillary products are currently being shopped out with several carriers. It has come down to 2 carriers who have very competitive proposals. The two companies are Unum and Metlife. Brian Loman will make his recommendation on what to do with ancillaries at September's Executive Board.

Strive for Five - Nurse/Advocate:

Brian Loman talked to the board regarding adding a nurse/advocate to the Strive for Five program. This will help keep claims down and assist with members navigating through the medical world and help with scheduling. Brian wanted some feedback on what the board thinks about hiring a nurse/advocate before moving forward. Brian Loman and Kelly Grebinsky believes this could potentially save the IERMP quite a bit of money.

Kristie Greenburg from BPC discussed the email that went out to all districts who have a FSA, HRA, HSA and POP accounts regarding mandatory plan changes and optional plan amendments due to COVID.
