Financials:

St. Joseph-Ogden CHSD #305 made the motion and Fisher CUSD 1 seconded the motion to approve financials through November 21st. No expenses for the month of November. Total balance in the trust account is \$1,438,827.54 and \$174,060.63 in the wellness account.

COBRA implementation update -Lars Knudsen & Sami Drinkwater: Currently working on an automatic feed with BCBS and waiting on 60% of the groups to finalize their information.

BCBS 2024 OE update & Outpatient Surgical copays for \$500 & \$700 plans – Ainsley McDaniel – Per Federal and State guideline, plans must follow certain guidelines to stay in parity, and there is one benefit which in not meeting the requirements – outpatient surgical copays. The outpatient surgical services include a copay on the \$500 & \$700 plans. The copays need to be removed and the deductible must apply. This only affects 2-3 districts and it's a richer benefit for the member.

Ancillary update- Tresica Foreman – Still waiting on a few censuses to come in from some districts. The transition is going smoothly compared to the last time we moved the ancillaries.

Discuss and approve schools eligible to join the IERMP at standard rates:

Bismarck-Henning CUSD #1 made the motion and St. Joseph-Ogden CHSD #305 seconded the motion to approve Hall High School District #502 to come into the IERMP.

Discuss and approve schools eligible to join the IERMP at non-standard rates:

Bismarck-Henning CUSD #1 made the motion and Salt Fork CUSD #512 seconded the motion to approve the following schools at non-standard rates:

St. Joseph Grade 84 enrolled Warrnesburg Lathan CUSD 88 enrolled

Approved by roll call vote: 5-0

Discussion on two open positions - **Davis (until August 2024) and Mentzer (August 2026)** – some have expressed interest in filling these two positions. The open positions will be appointed during December's meeting.

Speaker, Christo Schultz, to discuss the trust account: Christo Schultz explained how the trust missed 9 months' worth of interest. The majority of the funds were held in a pass-through checking account (operating), since there was a lot of activity from when the account was opened up through December 2022. In January 2023, most of the funds should have been placed in a money market account which was earning around 5% interest. This was not done – so the trust lost out on around \$35,000 in interest. Christo presented 3 options on trying to recoup the lost interest: Option 1) 67% recovery - \$2,500 payment from Christo, Midland reducing 2024 fees by ½ and putting funds in a premium interest-bearing account to recoup \$23,877.83. Option 2) 75% recovery \$5,256.02 payment from Christo, reducing 2024 fees by ½ and putting funds in a premium interest-bearing account to recoup \$26,633.85. Option 3) 100% recovery \$14,133.97 payment from Christo, reducing 2024 fees by ½ and putting funds in a premium interest-bearing account to recoup \$35,511.80.

Discussion and vote on Midland States Bank Trust Account: After much discussion, St. Joseph-Ogden CHSD #305 made the motion and Bismarck-Henning CUSD #1 seconded the motion to accept option A) receive \$2,500 from Christo, Midland reducing 2024 fees by ½ and putting the funds in a premium interest-bearing account. In 2024 the trust will revisit interest options and the relationship with Midland States Bank.
